 There s eggs in the basket, pray take care;

 If you should chance to over walk me,

 At the Half-way House pray leave them there".
- 4. At the half-way house they pass-ed by.
 And another ale house they did draw nigh
 Landlord landlord bring out some bacon
 There's eggs in the basket we'll have a fry.

- 5. The landlord went unto the basket
 Thinking some eggs there he would find
 "O jolly sailors you are mistaken.
 Instead of eggs there is a child."
- 6. One of the sailors set out a-fretting.

 The other one says not worth a while.

 Here's a 100 I will pay down

 To any young woman that will take this child.
- 7. Pretty Nancy standing by the fire She hears the words the sailor said. I'll take the child and kindly use it As soon as the money is laid down.
- 8. Are you the girl they call pretty Nancy That I danced with last Easter Day. Oh yes kind sir and I took your fancy And now the fiddler you must pay.
- 9. "Let us go down to yonder chapel And there the knot it shall be tied Bells are ringing sailors singing We will enjoy that happy bride"
